
## Some Future Changes for Garbage Pickup to note:

- BULK Items will require scheduled pickups, and a Fee may apply;
- Hardfill and Building Debris will be scheduled pickups;
- Your weekly pickup day may change;
- There will be two pickup days: one day for trash, one for recyclables.
- Each residence will receive two 96-gal totes, one for trash, one for recycling;

Please know that there will be Informational Meetings scheduled soon, dates TBD.



Keep in mind the Codes Dept is a valuable resource to guide you on any upcoming projects, big or small. Please remember to contact Mike Jones with any questions.






#### Want to learn more about Climate Change? Join us for our Renewable Fayetteville Workshop Series!
