RECYCLING PICKUP - TUES & WED

MUST SCHEDULE AHEAD FOR SPECIAL PICKUPS (Bulk Items; Hardfill; Debris)

FEE FOR MATTRESS & TIRE PICKUPS or BULK (10 or more) ITEMS (i.e. HOUSE CLEANOUTS)

MUST FIT COMPLETELY INSIDE CART, WITH LID CLOSED; Trash must be bagged, no loose trash.

Carts arrive May 20-2

- ⇒ NEW PICKUP DAYS START week of Memorial Day MAY 28-31
- ⇒ CARTS will be delivered to each property around MAY 20– 21
- ⇒ MUST CALL AHEAD to schedule pickup of any bulky items, hard fill, and/ or building debris

What do you do with your old garbage cans & blue bins?



For the first two weeks, they can be collected by the DPW; just leave them out on trash pickup day.

After June ___, schedule for a bulk pickup before 2nd Wednesday of month. There will also be a dumpster in front of DPW garage just for blue bins.

⇒Pick up 1st and 3rd Friday of month ⇒Items that will be acceptable for program:

Vegetable, fruit scraps, coffee grounds, tea. ⇒Items that will NOT be acceptable for program

Meat, fish, bones, dairy, eggs, bread, animal waste, grass clippings.

 \Rightarrow You can use BPI certified compostable tote liners. Plastic and paper bags are not to be used.

We are taking it slow to improve our systems and grow the program. We will adjust systems and program to serve our residents and provide a valued program for our residents.

We still have room for a few additional participants! Call or email me as soon as possible to participate and receive a 13-gal compost cart.
